Your 2016-2017 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and a parent whose information was reported on the FAFSA must complete and sign this verification document, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to us. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact us as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

How To Order A Tax Return Transcript

1. Online Request – Go to www.irs.gov, under the Tools heading on the IRS homepage, click “Get A Tax Transcript.” Click “Get Transcript By Mail.” Be sure to request the “**IRS Tax Return Transcript**” and **NOT** the “IRS Tax Account Transcript.”

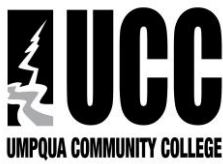
