## President's Report to the Board of Education – September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023

- UCC staff and faculty kicked off the new academic year with a full week of activities that included an amazing keynote address by Dr. Donna Beegle. Dr. Beegle is a nationally known author on the crisis of poverty and how generational poverty affects educational, health and legal outcomes.
- UCC has 5 new faculty Riverhawks on board this fall in Mechatronics, History and Education combined, Nursing, Forestry and Math.
- Our on-campus community partner, Maple Corner Montessori opened for the school year to weeks ago with an additional classroom space in our tech building that has allowed the school to expand further into middle school grades. We are proud to have this wonderful school on our campus.
- Total number of students and FTE are still settling out but at this time our enrollment appears to be at least 5% increase over last year with many of our areas still to report. Notable programs that have considerable growth include Dental Assisting, Certified Nurse Assistant, and Theatre Arts.
- The Wolf Creek Jobs Corps is onboarding an additional 12 students every two weeks and hopes to get to its capacity number of 190 by the end of the year. There are currently around 40 students enrolled. In addition, the Wolf Creek Education Department was recently voted the best department at the job corps. We are proud that the education department is run by amazing UCC faculty and staff.
- UCC moved 104 students into UCC owned housing and 70 students into housing that UCC leases for students for a grand total of 174 students. Many thanks to Brittany Weerheim who is a one woman show as our Housing Director and doing an amazing job with the program.
- Roseburg Forest Products donated a truck to the UCC truck driving program. This helps our students get more hands-on learning time in a vehicle that reflects the ones they will be driving when they graduate.
- The library remodel project is due to complete during the second week of October, and we will host a soft opening at that time. We are very excited for the reimagined student space and believe the study and gathering opportunities that will be housed in reimagined building will enhance the student experience and ultimately student success.
- The athletic program is off to a great start with Volleyball, Soccer and Cross Country already into their seasons. The program will likely enroll 230 students this year, their highest ever number.
