



#### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Welcome and thank you for your interest in Umpqua Community College's (UCC) Registered Nursing Program!

THE CONSORTIUM - The Umpqua Community College Nursing Program has joined with other community college programs and all campuses of the OHSU in a unified approach to nursing education. This coalition of statewide nursing educators and programs is known as the Oregon Consortium for Nursing Education (OCNE). Please visit the OCNE website at <a href="http://www.ocne.org/index.html">http://www.ocne.org/index.html</a>. OCNE schools have comparable prerequisites and application processes for students.

DEGREE OPTIONS - Acceptance to the program allows for co-admission to UCC and OHSU nursing programs. Co-admission is an agreement that applicants who are admitted to UCC would be eligible to complete a Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Nursing at OHSU without an additional competitive application process. The co-admitted student would matriculate and be entered into the OHSU student record system, following successful completion of 6 terms of the nursing curriculum at UCC. Students completing the AAS will meet the educational requirements to be eligible to sit for the RN-licensure examination (NCLEX-RN). Students would complete four additional terms of full-time study to earn the Bachelor of Science Degree with a Major in Nursing through OHSU. Students would be able to remain in Roseburg to complete the BSN degree. Students who need part time study will have a two-year time frame to complete the BSN program at OHSU. Student must complete all arts, letters, and sciences courses during the first year in order to progress into the final year of nursing courses at OHSU. Beyond the two-year limit, interested students would need to apply directly to OHSU.

LENGTH OF PROGRAM - The Program is designed to provide students the option of completing an Associate's degree from UCC and/or a bachelor's degree in nursing from OHSU. As such, the course work is outlined in a "four-year" framework.

- YEAR ONE: Prerequisite coursework
- YEAR TWO: First year OCNE curriculum UCC- Students can sit for their PN-NCLEX after successfully completing the first year of the OCNE curriculum.
- YEAR THREE: Second year OCNE curriculum UCC students may earn an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree and be eligible to take the NCLEX-RN licensure test.
- YEAR FOUR: Upper division nursing coursework through OHSU with upper division arts, letters, and sciences from an accredited university. At the end of this year, students will earn a Bachelor of Science degree.

**DEMANDS OF THE PROGRAM** - It is important to understand the mental and physical demands of the nursing program and the career of the nurse. Applicants to the nursing program must be physically and mentally able to cope with the rigors of the curriculum and the demanding nature of the health professions. Nursing students must be able to grasp scientific concepts, set up and answer basic math and algebra problems, and communicate well verbally and in writing. Physically, students must be able to remain on their feet for extended periods, lift up to 25 pounds, hear heart and breath sounds, read fine print and identify skin tones such as pale, ashen, gray or bluish.

Established academic and clinical requirements essential to the program of instruction apply to all students and cannot be waived. Attempts will be made to accommodate and retain qualified applicants with disabilities unless results of evaluations indicate that given reasonable accommodation an individual will still be unable to perform the technical standards required by the program. A complete list of the required technical standards is available in the Office of Accessibility Services and the Nursing Program Office. Persons with questions concerning qualifications are encouraged to contact the Accessibility Services Office to arrange an appointment for individual consultation and advice prior to application.

### **ADMISSION PROCESS**

### Step 1, UCC Admissions, consider beginning this process now only if:

- You are brand new to UCC, Apply to UCC. List your major as AAOT-Pre-Nursing and apply for Fall.
- You have been a UCC student and have a not taken a UCC credit course within the last year, reapply to UCC. List your
  major as AAOT-Pre-Nursing and apply for Fall.
- You are a current UCC student, ensure your major is AAOT-Pre-Nursing by referring to your Student Self-Service
  account through your Academic Transcript. If the major is incorrect, you need to complete a change of major form or
  contact an advisor.

### **Step 2, Transcripts:**

If you have completed college coursework outside of UCC, submit official college transcript from each issuing institution\* to:

\*If your coursework is from a college outside of Oregon, please also provide course descriptions and/or syllabi from the year you took the course.

**Disclaimer** - Incorrectly titled transcripts (not designated as "Nursing") may not be sorted accurately or processed in a timely manner.

Transfer coursework from Foreign Institutions – These official transcripts must be evaluated by the application deadline by an outside credential evaluation service. The evaluation company must be either AACRAO Foreign Education Credential Service (www.aacrao.org) or a member of the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES). For a list of NACES memberships, please refer to their web site at www.naces.org. The evaluation must be a course-by-course evaluation with an official copy submitted to the Admissions, Registration and Records Office. The coursework must be at a post-secondary level, have comparable UCC accreditation status and be parallel in content to UCC coursework. The outside evaluation must also be completed for secondary level education for any evaluation of that coursework toward UCC admission requirements.

### **Step 4, Nursing Application, SUBMITTED BY FEBRUARY 15**

### **ADMISSION PROCESS (cont.)**

**REQUIRED DOCUMENTS -** A checklist of required documents is provided as part of the application packet. The documents include:

- Completed Nursing Application Checklist
- OCNE/UCC Nursing Program Application
- <u>Program Application Fee</u>: Applicants must submit the \$50.00 non-refundable Nursing Program Application fee with the application. Applications will not be considered without this fee.
- Year One: Prerequisite Course Planning Sheet
- Other Official Documents as described in the packet and on the checklist

#### **APPLICANT NOTIFICATION**

Applicants will be notified in writing of their eligibility.





#### APPLICATION CRITERIA

To be eligible for application, applicants must meet the requirements described below:

- 1. Pre-program Coursework and Grade Point Average Students must complete 28 credits of the 47-49 credit pre-program (prerequisite) courses with a letter grade of "C-" or better **and** a prerequisite cumulative **GPA of 3.00** at the time of application completion. These credits must be completed prior to the application deadline and must include Math 95 or higher and Human Anatomy & Physiology I (Entire A&P series must be completed prior to Fall entry of the Nursing Program and be taken within the last 10 years).
- 2. Once the student submits their application, they will be given instructions to complete entrance testing. Entrance exam must be completed no later than FEBRUARY 16th, 2024, at 5PM.

After the application process is complete, a select number of students will be offered a spot to sit for the Essay and the Interview.

- 1. Proctored Essay Must be registered prior to the testing date and bring cash or money order as payment on their testing date.
- Complete Interview process.

#### **Proctored Essay**

Up to 200% of available positions will be invited to sit for the proctored essay. Applicants must submit a \$25.00 non-refundable processing fee by CHECK or MONEY ORDER ONLY at the proctored essay sign-in table. The selected proctored essay candidates should expect to hear from the nursing department via email and US Mail. Notifications will be delivered by the beginning of March. The scheduled date(s) for the proctored essay will be mid to late March.

#### Essay question(s) will be based on one or more of the areas listed below:

**Diversity**: The applicant expresses understanding, respect for, and/or experience with varied backgrounds, cultures, ethnicity, and lifestyles.

**Integrity**: The applicant responds to situational questions in a manner that demonstrates integrity and values compatible with nursing core values and code of ethics.

**Communication**: The applicant effectively conveys information, feelings, and opinions to others orally and/or in writing in a respectful and inclusive manner. Whether oral or written, information is organized and clear.

**Motivational fitness**: The applicant identifies expectations about nursing role and responsibilities that are congruent with reality and demonstrates suitability to the role.

**Resilience**: The applicant demonstrates the ability to recover from setbacks in the face of adversity and persistence to overcome barriers. The applicant describes strategies/behaviors that would enable maintaining stable performance under pressure.

**Transferable skills**: The applicant responds to situational questions in a manner that demonstrates skills such as problem solving, curiosity, leadership, critical thinking, ability to work in a diverse team to achieve group goals.

An established scoring criteria will be used that is used by other OCNE institutions. Applicants will not have access to their interview scoring or evaluation scoring criteria at any time per OCNE guidelines.

#### Academic and/or testing accommodations:

UCC is committed to supporting all students. 
**Tie Breakers:** In the event that two or more applicant scores in Phase I cluster at the cut-off point, UCC will use tie breakers in the following order: In- district students, Pre-requisite GPA (specific GPA, not range), veteran or active military status. If two or more applicant scores tie in Phase II, and also for ranking applicants for alternate status, UCC will use tie breakers in the following order: Interview score, essay score, In-district students, Pre-requisite GPA (specific GPA, not range), veteran or active military status.

#### UCC and OCNE reserve the right to change or update the areas to be assessed as necessary.

Please note: Students who live in-district\* at the time of application may potentially have preference into the program. (Yellow area is not considered In-District)

### **ON ACCEPTANCE**

**Notification** – Applicants will be notified of their acceptance via US Mail and preferred email. Upon notification of acceptance, admitted students must indicate in writing by the stated deadline their intention to enroll or their position will be given to the next eligible alternate.

Credit Completion - Courses need to be completed from the "Prerequisite Course Sheet" provided in this application, Sections A- H, prior to starting the fall Nursing Courses.

• 47-49 credits must be earned prior to the first term of the nursing program.

Mandatory Orientation - Three mandatory orientation dates will be held for admitted students. Attendance is required at all orientations, or the next eligible candidate will be given your assigned place in the program. The tentative dates for these orientations are August 20, 2024, September 4th and September 5th, 2024. Additional information will be included in the acceptance letter.

Proof of Immunizations/Titers – Accepted students must submit proof of the following immunizations by the stated deadline, or their space will be given to the next eligible alternate:

- Immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella (chicken pox)
- Tetanus-Diphtheria-Pertussis Toxoid within the last 10 years
- Hepatitis B— You may be required to provide proof of immunity after the series is complete. If not immune, the series must be started by the stated deadline and can be completed during the first year of the program.

COVID-19 Vaccination - Please note that is it highly recommended that healthcare students are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 due to requirements for UCC healthcare programs and courses which must follow federal, state, and local COVID-19 mandates. UCC makes reasonable accommodations for the academic needs of students with qualified medical or religious exemptions. However, local agencies and healthcare facilities may decide to exclude students who are not fully vaccinated for COVID-19 from participating in activities at their locations, including activities that are part of UCC's clinical rotations or other degree requirements.

Although UCC can request that these local agencies or healthcare facilities consider a student's documented request for a medical or religious exemption, UCC cannot overturn their decisions, or guarantee that reasonable accommodations such as alternate clinical hours or practice sites for non-vaccinated students can be obtained during a pandemic. Therefore, healthcare students who are not fully vaccinated may not be able to receive clinical or agency placements and may be unable to complete UCC's healthcare program course requirements at that time. Please also be aware that UCC cannot predict whether additional government mandates regarding COVID-19 vaccinations, or any other requirements may be imposed in the future.

Drug Screening – Upon acceptance students will be required to complete and pass a drug screening by Urine Analysis (UA) at a UCC selected location. The program coordinator will provide information on the drug screening process upon admission to the program. (UA) fees (~\$80) are the responsibility of the student.

CPR card - From the American Heart Association (BLS Provider). This is the only card accepted by UCC Nursing programs/courses:



Background History Check - All accepted students will be required to undergo a background history check, prior to entering the program. Individuals with a criminal record may not be allowed into a healthcare facility as a student. Because it is not possible to meet the objectives of the program without having clinical experience, anyone with a positive history or abuse history may not be eligible for acceptance in the nursing program. Additionally, the Oregon State Board of Nursing has limits on eligibility for licensure, as defined in OAR 851-031. Ultimately, licensure may be denied to graduates with a criminal offense and those with a major physical or mental condition that could affect the individual's ability to practice nursing safely.

<u>Consent to Photograph and Record</u> – (Provided in acceptance packet.) Sign and turn in at orientation.

Applications are accepted from the beginning of January through mid-February See box with important dates. Please make sure that you are working off the most current application packet. The applications must be postmarked by the application deadline or received by 5 p.m. via the post-office. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. When does UCC accept students into the program? Entrance is Fall term. Letters of acceptance are sent around the end of April or early May.
- 3. How do I get accepted to the UCC nursing program? Please refer to the Admissions Point System for more information.
- **4.** Is there a waiting List? Qualified students should have their CPR and titers/immunizations completed in case the student receives a call to offer them a position in the program. Spaces may become available one month after the initial acceptance/decline letters go out. Please do not call the Nursing Department regarding where you "stand" on the wait list. You will not be informed of where you "stand" on the wait list.
- **4. What are my chances of being accepted into the program once I've completed the minimum requirements?** Because admission is competitive and based on a point scale, it is difficult to predict the chances of acceptance in advance. It is important to be as successful as possible in your prerequisite coursework. Please refer to the Admissions Point System for a breakdown of how applicants are assessed.
- **5. What if I'm not accepted into the program when I apply?** Students not admitted to the program must reapply the following year to be reconsidered for admission. Previous application materials including transcripts will not be forwarded or duplicated for a new application.
- **6.** If there is a nursing shortage, why doesn't UCC admit more applicants? UCC is exploring ways to expand its programs to educate more nurses. Our policy is to admit students based upon our funding and resources.
- 7. What kind of time commitment can I expect the program to involve? The nursing program demands a great deal of time. In addition to classroom time, students will spend an average of 10-12 hours per week in the Bonnie Ford Health, Nursing, and Science Center and at clinical practice sites (in hospitals, long-term care, and community health settings). It is anticipated that students will require 3 hours of study/coursework per credit hour (ex: 12 hours of study/course work for a 4-credit course). Clinical hours are scheduled during times that nurses typically work which could be morning, evening, or swing shift. As you can imagine, this schedule requires a lot of flexibility from you, your family, your employer, and your childcare provider.
- **8. Can I work when I am enrolled in the nursing program?** The nursing program is an intense program with classes and clinical placements. Students may find working even part time difficult. For many students, employment while attending school is necessary. Jobs with flexible schedules are desirable in these circumstances. Students must adjust work hours to accommodate their school schedule.
- 9. Can students complete the program part time or is it offered on-line?

The nursing program is a full-time program of study. UCC's nursing courses are not offered online due to the required clinical and lab hours. However, all nursing courses are enhanced with a Learning Management System (CANVAS).
