BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

June 14, 2023

The Umpqua Community College Board of Education had a regular meeting on Wednesday, June 14, 2023, in room 17 of Tap^hòyt^ha' Hall at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Oregon; the meeting was live-streamed on YouTube. Board Chair Loosley called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and the pledge of allegiance was given.

Directors present: Guy Kennerly, Steve Loosley, Twila McDonald, Erica Mills, and Bud Smith

Directors excused: David Littlejohn and Randy Richardson

Citizen Comments: There were no comments.

Changes to the Agenda: There were no changes to the agenda.

REPORTS

- **Association Representative**: Mick Davis, UCCFA President, shared faculty student-focused activities, outreaches, and grant updates.
- **Student Services Workplan:** Jim Pittman, Vice President Student Services, presented the Student Services Workplan for 2023-2026. The plan focuses on three areas: 1.) increasing opportunity for student housing and an early college growth plan; 2.) increasing value to students and the community; and 3.) focusing on the future through technology improvements and helping students complete a student educational plan.
- **President's Report Rachel Pokrandt, Ph.D.:** The UCC Nursing program, which is currently accredited by the state, is seeking national accreditation through ACEN; they will visit the

College from Oct. 10-12. A written report is posted on the website; highlights of the report were shared. As a part of an effort to provide alternative instructional delivery methods to students a new truck driving school cohort has started that meets during evenings and

students a new truck driving school cohort has started that meets during evenings and weekends. The News Review has provided spectacular coverage of the great things going on around campus. The College is quickly moving forward in renovating the recently purchased downtown buildings. A special board meeting will be held for an alternative contracting method approval. Graduation and the Nurses Pinning are this Friday.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution No. 20 – Adopting the Budget

Natalya Brown, Chief Financial Officer, requested the Board adopt the budget and make appropriations for the 2023-2024 year. The budget and changes were reviewed.

MOTION: I move that the Budget Committee of Umpqua Community College approve the budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 in the total of \$76,704,796. Motion by Dir. McDonald, seconded by Dir. Smith, and unanimously approved.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Budget Committee of Umpqua Community College hereby approves the budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 in the total of \$76,704,796 now on file in the Library of Umpqua Community College, 1140 Umpqua College Road, Roseburg, Oregon.

MOTION: I move to approve the imposed tax for the fiscal year 2023-2024 at the rate of \$0.4551/\$1,000 of assessed value. Motion by Dir. McDonald, seconded by Dir. Kennerly, and unanimously approved.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Budget Committee of Umpqua Community College hereby approves the imposed taxes provided for in the approved budget at the rate of \$0.4551/\$1,000 of assessed value for operations and that these taxes are hereby imposed and categorized for the tax year 2023-24 upon the assess value of all taxable property within the district. Katie Workman and Natalya Brown were appreciated for their enormous work on the budget.

Chair Loosley shared the results of President Pokrandt's annual evaluation. The Board evaluated Dr. Pokrandt using the key presidential priorities for the past year along with the items in the newly launched strategic "doing" plan. The Board gave Dr. Pokrandt consistently high marks in nearly all areas. A few highlights were shared from her work that was accomplished over the past year. The Board is very pleased with her performance.

Umpqua Community College might choose to offer limited number of tuition waivers as encouragement for students to continue their education contingent of funding availability. Waivers must be used for tuition only based on eligibility criteria set by the College. Eligibility criteria can be found in the corresponding procedure. Cash refunds shall not be given, and unused funds shall not be credited toward future terms. Any exceptions to the tuition waiver policy are approved by the President or designee.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") is entered into by and between Umpqua Community College, hereinafter referred to as the "College," and the Association of Classified Employees of Umpqua Community College, hereinafter referred to as the "Association."

The College and the Association have concluded the 2023 reopener negotiations as outlined in Article 25, Term and Execution of Agreement, of the Classified Bargaining Agreement, hereinafter referred to as the "CBA". The College and the Association agree to the following changes and additions to the 2021-2025 CBA:

ARTICLE 14 - Compensation, Section A.1. will have the following addition: .

Effective July 1, 2023, the first step of each grade on the Classified Wage Schedule will be increased by 2.5%, and the index between each step will remain 2.25%.

ARTICLE 15 - Employee Benefits, Section A will have the following addition:

Effective October 1, 2023, the College's monthly contribution to insurance benefits will be increased by \$25 to a maximum of \$1455, \$1505 for those making less than \$36,000 per year.

Subject: Resolution #2, Increase Appropriation Date: July 12, 2023

This is a resolution to increase appropriation in the Special Revenue Fund – Grants & Contracts.

UCC has received a new award from Douglas Educational Service District in the amount of \$95,000.

This award supports a portion of the Work Based Learning Coordinator position for two years. The WBL Coordinator will plan, coordinate, and execute work-based learning experiences between local k-12 school districts, Umpqua Community College, and industry/business partners.

UCC has received a new award from the Oregon Health Authority in the amount of \$300,000 through January 31, 2025.

This award is part of the SHOI-Like scholarship grant and will provide scholarships to students (upon approved application) who are enrolled in Behavioral Health courses: HS110 (peer recovery), Addiction Studies, and Addiction Treatment.

UCC has received a new two-year award from the State of Oregon. Year one total is \$170,035.

First generation and low-income students will be recruited to attend specialized skill building workshops and receive wraparound support services to drive their success. These students will receive scholarship incentives and will be required to meet with an advisor to identify their pathway to completion within the first 12 months of enrollment at the college.
